2020 NLA Conference "Together Facing Forward" Frequently Asked Questions

What kinds of conference program proposals are available?

Pre-conference Wednesday (half-day afternoon) or regular 50-minute conference programs (lecture, workshop or panel formats) on Thursday and Friday

When do I submit a proposal for a pre-conference or regular program to be offered at the NLA 2020 Annual Conference?

Proposal submissions are due by Saturday April 11, 2020.

How do I submit a proposal?

Complete the information found on the google form created for conference submissions.

How do I submit more than one proposal?

Complete the google form once for each proposal.

When will I be notified if my proposal has been accepted?

Notification for accepted proposals will take place before May 31, 2020.

How many program sessions will be offered at the 2020 Annual Conference?

At this time, we plan to have 8 breakout rooms and 8 sessions over the course of both days (Thursday and Friday) for a total of 64 possible sessions. Among those sessions we will likely be scheduling business meetings for the Round Tables of NLA.

What criteria will the Conference Program Selection Committee (CPSC) use to evaluate and select the programs?

The CPSC will use a blind submission process. It will be important to omit presenter names from the descriptions of programs.

The CPSC will evaluate whether program submissions meet the following criteria:

- Content is relevant to Nebraska libraries and librarianship
- Content is unique and different from other programs
- Content identifies clarity of purpose and is relevant to selected target audience(s)
- Content could be repurposed (e.g. webcast, online course, article) to ensure it has a life after the program

Will proposals from individuals and proposals from sections, interest groups, or division-level committees be evaluated the same way?

Yes. All proposals will be evaluated using the same blind selection criteria.

How will the date and time of a presentation be determined?

Programs will be scheduled by the NLA Conference Planners. Programs will be spread across the entire array of time slots. Potential presenters will need to indicate specific limitations - e.g. "should not conflict with...," "speaker only available on Thursday," etc.

Is a Section, Interest Group, or Committee required to submit a program each year?

No, a section, interest group, or committee is not required to have a program annually. Some groups may want to sponsor programs every other year. Groups may also consider co-sponsoring programs with other sections, interest groups, or committees.

What if I need funding for a program, including travel expenses or honoraria for non-librarian speakers? The various units of the Nebraska Library Association may have funds available for programs that require an honoraria, travel expenses, etc. Individuals are encouraged to reach out to a relevant unit for advice on availability of funds.
